A READING FROM THE BOOK OF THE PROPHET JEREMIAH

Then those who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are the most pitiable people of all. ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Today is Music Scholarship Sunday. The Polish National Catholic Church has a strong tradition based in the use of music in its liturgies and provides budding musicians of our church with scholarships to continue musical training and study. LITURGICAL NOTES - Today is termed “Septuagesima Sunday” when the Traditional Rite of Mass is being celebrated. It can be thought of as a transitional Sunday, while the celebration of Christmas is still fresh in the mind of the Church. Septuagesima Sunday along with Sexagesima and Quinquagesima Sundays begin to direct our hearts and minds to the Holy Season of Great Lent and the Lenten mysteries concentrating on the Passion of Our Lord. The liturgical color of these Sunday is Rose or Purple.

If the contemporary Rite of Mass were being used today, we would find ourselves in the Liturgical Season termed “Ordinary Time” the liturgical color of which is green.
