

First Sunday of Advent



A Sabbath Thought

There *is* something to wait for. The shoot *will* blossom, the promise *will* materialize, the Lord *will* come again. What we *expect* should color our lives. *Who* we wait for should warm our hearts.

About Today's Bible Readings:

JEREMIAH 33:14-16

This Advent season is rooted in the ancient promise outlined here: A bare shoot will blossom into salvation, safety and security for all God's people.

PSALM 25:4-5, 8-9, 10, 14 R. To you, O Lord, I lift my soul.

1 THESSALONIANS 3:12-4:2

We make our own this prayer of Paul's for the Thessalonians: "May God strengthen our hearts, making them holy and blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ."

LUKE 21:25-28, 34-36

The thought of the end may be scary, but its meaning is clear: With Christ's coming, our redemption will be complete. Therefore, we can hold our heads high.

THE GOSPEL (LUKE 21:25-28, 34-36)

Jesus said to his disciples: "There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on earth nations will be in dismay, perplexed by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will die of fright in anticipation of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. But when these signs begin to happen, stand erect and raise your heads because your redemption is at hand.

"Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life, and that day catch you by surprise like a trap. For that day will assault everyone who lives on the face of the earth. Be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man."
