Second Sunday - Ordinary Time

A Sabbath Thought

At the challenging instigation of his mother, Jesus works the first of his miraculous signs at a wedding in Cana of Galilee. The scene raises a question for us: How can we move God to act in our lives?

About Today's Bible Readings

ISAIAH 62:1-5

The Lord God will be the people's bridegroom, says the prophet, and God's love will work marvelous transformations.

Responsorial Psalm: 96:1-2, 2-3, 7-8, 9-10

1 CORINTHIANS 12:4-11

The Spirit is the cement that holds together the living stones of Christ's Church.

JOHN 2:1-11

In the sign of abundant wine at a wedding feast, Jesus gives a foretaste of what is to come in the kingdom.

ENTRANCE RITE (JOHN 2:11)

- V. Jesus did this as the beginning of His signs in Cana in Galilee and so revealed His glory,
- R. And His disciples began to believe in Him.
- V. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,
- R. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

THE GOSPEL (JOHN 2:1-11)

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from although the servers who had drawn the water knew, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

This is the Gospel of the Lord!
