About Today's Bible Readings

ISAIAH 43:16-21

The prophet reminds us that our story is one of hope. God's relationship with us involves us in a journey through redemption.

R. The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy.

PHILIPPIANS 3:8-14

Like runners in the midst of a race, disciples are in movement toward a goal: formation in the image of Christ.

JOHN 8:1-11

The Saviour who doodles in the dirt disarms the critics and, at the same time, rescues the criticized.

ENTRANCE RITE (2 Corinthians 5:17-18)

- V. So whoever is in Christ is a new creation: the old things have passed away; behold, new things have come.
- R. And all this is from God, Who has reconciled us to Himself through Christ and given us the ministry of reconciliation.
- V. You Who have suffered wounds for us,
- R. Lord, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us.

Tract (Recited in place of the Alleluia during Lent)

- V. Merciful and gracious is the Lord, slow to anger and abounding in kindness.
- R. As a father has compassion on his children, so the Lord has compassion on the faithful. For He knows how we are formed, remembers that we are dust.

THE GOSPEL (John 8:1-11)

Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. But early in the morning he arrived again in the temple area, and all the people started coming to him, and he sat down and taught them. Then the scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery and made her stand in the middle. They said to him, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery. Now in the law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. So what do you say?" They said this to test him, so that they could have some charge to bring against him. Jesus bent down and began to write on the ground with his finger. But when they continued asking him, he straightened up and said to them, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Again he bent down and wrote on the ground. And in response, they went away one by one, beginning with the elders. So he was left alone with the woman before him. Then Jesus straightened up and said to her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" She replied, "No one, sir." Then Jesus said, "Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more."

This is the Gospel of the Lord!
