

The Third Sunday of Advent

A Sabbath Thought

To make our faith our own, we need to ask Jesus the questions in our hearts, and to listen with our hearts to his response.

About Today's Bible Readings

ISAIAH 35:1-6, 10

Isaiah echoes the deepest longing of the people: to be touched by their God with healing and joy.

Responsorial Psalm: 146:6-7, 8-9, 9-10

R. Lord, come and save us.

JAMES 5:7-10

James exhorts us to patiently wait for the Lord's coming, demonstrating the paradox that Christ's healing of the world is both 'already' and 'not yet'.

MATTHEW 11:2-11

John the Baptist sends Jesus a piercing question: "Are you the one?" Jesus' response makes the connection between his unique ministry and the tradition that undergirds John.

ENTRANCE RITE – Isaiah 26:19b; 29:19

- V. Awake and sing, you who lie in the dust. For your dew is a dew of light, and the land of shades gives birth.
- R. The lowly will ever find joy in the Lord, and the poor rejoice in the Holy One of Israel.
- V. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,
- R. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

THE GOSPEL - MATTHEW 11:2-11

When John the Baptist heard in prison of the works of the Christ, he sent his disciples to Jesus with this question, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?" Jesus said to them in reply, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them. And blessed is the one who takes no offense at me."

As they were going off, Jesus began to speak to the crowds about John, "What did you go out to the desert to see? A reed swayed by the wind? Then what did you go out to see? Someone dressed in fine clothing? Those who wear fine clothing are in royal palaces. Then why did you go out? To see a prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. This is the one about whom it is written: Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way before you. Amen, I say to you, among those born of women there has been none greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he."

This is the Gospel of the Lord!
