Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

A Sabbath Thought

It is all too easy to close our eyes. In that way, we refuse to be *seers*, prophets who pierce through the pain that others avoid. Through that suffering, we attain the vision of God's glory.

About Today's Bible Readings

JEREMIAH 20:10-13

The prophet is out of step with his contemporaries. He sees what they do not see, he coming of God's salvation.

Responsorial Psalm: 69:8-10, 14, 17, 33-35

R. Lord, in your great love, answer me.

ROMANS 5:12-15

We sinned and God saved. But this divine salvation is overkill or, better still, "over*life*", in response to our evil, God sent his Son to be our Saviour.

MATTHEW 10:26-33

Society knows how to deal with prophets. It silences them through intimidation and persecution. But these are idle threats, says Jesus, to those who profess his Name and honor his Father.
