### HEBREWS 5:1-6

The excerpt from Hebrews outlines some of the duties and responsibilities associated with the priesthood and reminds us that these obligations and rewards are indeed forever.

#### LUKE 5:1-11

Luke tells us that Jesus calls all of us, not just priests, to the task of saving souls by *fishing* for them with the nets of the Lord.

### THE GOSPEL: Luke 5:1-11

One day as Jesus was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret, the people were crowding around him and listening to the word of God.

He saw at the water's edge two boats, left there by the fishermen, who were washing their nets.

He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little from shore.

Then he sat down and taught the people from the boat.

When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch."

Simon answered, "Master, we've worked hard

all night and haven't caught anything.

But because you say so, I will let down the nets."

So they signaled their partners in the other boat

to come and help them, and they came and

filled both boats so full that they began to sink.

When Simon Peter saw this he and all his companions were astonished at the catch of fish they had taken.

Then Jesus said to Simon, "Don't be afraid; from now on you will be fishers of men."

So they pulled their boats up on shore, left everything and followed him.
