Second Sunday of Lent



A Sabbath Thought

Today's Lenten celebration invites us to look to the mountain, a place where our faith may be tested as was Abraham's. But the mountain is also a place where Jesus reveals his glory as a pledge of our triumph.

About Today's Bible Readings

GENESIS 22:1-2, 9, 10-13, 15-18

In a dramatic and haunting scene, Abraham finds his faith tested to the limits.

PSALM 116:10, 15, 16-17, 18-19

R. I will walk before the Lord, in the land of the living.

ROMANS 8:31-34

Jesus Christ is God's pledge of our salvation. What harm can come to those for whom God's Son has died?

MARK 9:2-10

On a mountain, Jesus reveals his glory and disturbs his disciples with talk of rising form the dead.

ENTRANCE RITE: Deuteronomy 5:24; Psalm 104:1b-2a

- V. The Lord, our God, has indeed let us see His glory and His majesty! We have heard His voice from the midst of the fire and have found out today that a man can still live after God has spoken with him.
- R. Lord, my God, You are great indeed! You are clothed with majesty and glory, robed in light as with a cloak.
- V. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,
- R. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

TRACT: 2 Peter 1:3-4 (Recited in place of the Alleluia)

- V. His divine power has bestowed on us everything that makes for life and devotion, through the knowledge of Him, Who called us by His own glory and power.
- R. Through these, He has bestowed on us the precious and very great promises, so that through them you may come to share in the divine nature, after escaping from the corruption that is in the world because of evil desire.

THE GOSPEL: Mark 9:2-10

Jesus took Peter, James, and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no fuller on earth could bleach them. Then Elijah appeared to them along with Moses, and they were conversing with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here! Let us make three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He hardly knew what to say, they were so terrified. Then a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; from the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone but Jesus alone with them.

As they were coming down from the mountain, he charged them not to relate what they had seen to anyone, except when the Son of Man had risen from the dead. So they kept the matter to themselves, questioning what rising from the dead meant.

This is the Gospel of the Lord!
