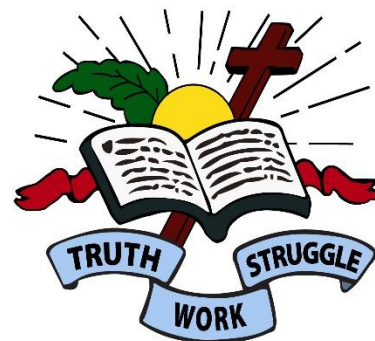

Tenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

A Sabbath Thought

We are intimately involved in the struggle between good and evil. There is no middle ground on which we can stand, no sanctuary we can seek except the shelter of the Lord Jesus who has already won the victory for us.

About Today's Bible Readings

GENESIS 3:9-15

In terms of human psychology, in light of human history, the ancient story of the origins of human evil rings true.

Responsorial Psalm: 130:1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 7-8

R: With the Lord there is mercy, and fullness of redemption.

2 CORINTHIANS 4:13-5:1

From the natural point of view, the human race may progress but individual persons are subject to the deprivations of time. In Jesus Christ, however, God has reversed that process of decay.

MARK 3:20-35

What human heart's desire is the subject of Jesus' preaching. He is the strong one who overcomes sin and evil.

ENTRANCE RITE: Isaiah 66:23; Psalms 95:6

V. You sit speaking against your brother; against your mother's son you spread rumors.

R. When you do these things, shall I be deaf to it? Or do you think that I am like yourself? I will correct you by drawing them up before your eyes.

R. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

THE GOSPEL: MARK 3:20-35

Jesus came home with his disciples. Again the crowd gathered, making it impossible for them even to eat. When his relatives heard of this they set out to seize him, for they said, "He is out of his mind." The scribes who had come from Jerusalem said, "He is possessed by Beelzebul," and "By the prince of demons he drives out demons."

Summoning them, he began to speak to them in parables, "How can Satan drive out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand; that is the end of him. But no one can enter a strong man's house to plunder his property unless he first ties up the strong man. Then he can plunder the house. Amen, I say to you, all sins and all blasphemies that people utter will be forgiven them. But whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will never have forgiveness, but is guilty of an everlasting sin." For they had said, "He has an unclean spirit."

His mother and his brothers arrived. Standing outside they sent word to him and called him. A crowd seated around him told him, "Your mother and your brothers and your sisters are outside asking for you." But he said to them in reply, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" And looking around at those seated in the circle he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers. For whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."

This is the Gospel of the Lord!
