Happy Father's Day!

A Sabbath Thought

Today we celebrate God's kingdom of which each of us is a seed. We are leaves on God's mighty tree, we are tiles in the mosaic of his plan. No one is too small or humble to harbor the power that will eventually blanket the universe.

About Today's Bible Readings

EZEKIEL 17:22-24

The tree nourished by God grows high and wide - a symbol of the kingdom whose shelter is available to all.

Responsorial Psalm: 92:2-3, 13-14, 15-16

R: Lord, it is good to give thanks to you.

2 CORINTHIANS 5:6-10

Believers live caught between faith and hope. We eagerly ache for the fulfillment promised in the word Christ preached.

MARK 4:26-34

What is this 'kingdom of God' of which Jesus spoke? Insight comes through several images of growth - small beginnings that yield gigantic results.

ENTRANCE RITE: Luke 17:20b-21; Daniel 6:26b

- V. The coming of the kingdom of God cannot be observed, and no one will announce: 'Look, here it is!' or 'There it is!' For behold, the kingdom of God is among you.
- R. For He is the living God, enduring forever; His kingdom shall not be destroyed, and His dominion shall be without end.
- V. Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.
- R. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen!

THE GOSPEL: MARK 4:26-34

Jesus said to the crowds:

"This is how it is with the kingdom of God; it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how. Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come."

He said,

"To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade." With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it. Without parables he did not speak to them, but to his own disciples he explained everything in private.

This is the Gospel of the Lord!
