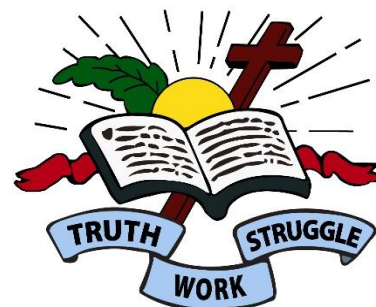

Sabbath Thought

About Today's Bible Readings

AMOS 7:12-15

Amos finds that prophesying is no way to win friends. But he can do no other because the Lord himself chose him.

Responsorial Psalm: 85:9-10, 11-12, 13-14

R: Lord, let us see your kindness, and grant us your salvation.

EPHESIANS 1:3-14

The letter to the Ephesians opens with this lengthy hymns of praise to God for all he has done for us in Jesus Christ.

MARK 6:7-13

Jesus sends the Twelve out on a mission. The only baggage they carry is the message they will preach: *repent*.

ENTRANCE RITE: Amos 3:7-8; Chronicles 20:20b

V. Indeed, the Lord God does nothing without revealing His plan to His servants, the prophets. The lion roars, who will not be afraid! The Lord God speaks, who will not prophesy!

R. Trust in the Lord, your God, and you will be found firm. Trust in His prophets, and you will succeed.

V. Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit.

R. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen!

THE GOSPEL: MARK 6:7-13

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits. He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick - no food, no sack, no money in their belts. They were, however, to wear sandals but not a second tunic. He said to them, "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them." So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.
