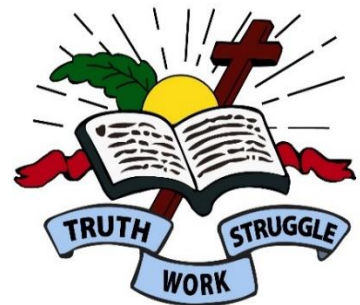

Twenty Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

A Sabbath Thought

.What is it that we seek from Jesus Christ? If it is power or prestige, then we are following the wrong Messiah. When we look to Christ, our response of faith engages us in a search for truth, goodness and love.

About Today's Bible Readings

ISAIAH 53:10-11

The suffering of the Lord's servant has a purpose: It brings redemption to many, it relieves the guilty of their sin.

Responsorial Psalm: 33:4-5, 18-19, 20, 22

R. Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you.

HEBREWS 4:14-16

Salvation is not exotic, and neither is our Saviour. Jesus is one of us, a relationship that should give us confidence.

MARK 10:35-45

The greatest paradox about Jesus is his notion of leadership. He measures greatness, not by power but by service.

ENTRANCE RITE – Hebrews 3:1; 4:15

V. Therefore, holy "brothers," sharing in a heavenly calling, reflect on Jesus, the apostle and High Priest of our confession.

R. For we do not have a High Priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one Who has similarly been tested in every way, yet without sin.

V. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,

R. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

THE GOSPEL – MARK 10:35-45

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to Jesus and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." He replied, "What do you wish me to do for you?" They answered him, "Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left." Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Can you drink the cup that I drink or be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" They said to him, "We can." Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink, you will drink, and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right or at my left is not mine to give but is for those for whom it has been prepared." When the ten heard this, they became indignant at James and John. Jesus summoned them and said to them, "You know that those who are recognized as rulers over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones make their authority over them felt. But it shall not be so among you. Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."
