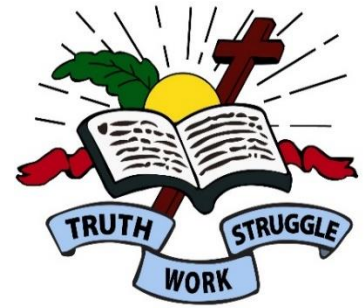

A Sabbath Thought

We speak of *the end* of the world, but Jesus really means its *goal*. We are going somewhere. When the Lord comes again, he will gather his faithful into the kingdom. That is the destiny to which we reach out in hope.

About Today's Bible Readings

DANIEL 12:1-3

In the few centuries before the coming of Christ, the Jewish people, oppressed and colonized, took comfort from promises of deliverance like the one in this prophecy.

Responsorial Psalm: 16:5, 8, 9-10, 11

R. You are my inheritance, O Lord!

HEBREWS 10:11-14, 18

The end has already happened! Jesus, our great high priest, has redeemed us, and we now work that redemption out in our lives.

MARK 13:24-32

The end is certain, says Jesus, but do not waste time on its timing. Simply "try to be in that number when the saints go marching in".

ENTRANCE RITE – 1 Corinthians 15:41-42

V. The brightness of the sun is one kind, the brightness of the moon another, and the brightness of the stars another. For star differs from star in brightness.

R. So also is the resurrection of the dead. It is sown corruptible; it is raised incorruptible.

V. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,

R. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

THE GOSPEL – MARK 13:24-32

Jesus said to his disciples: "In those days after that tribulation the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from the sky, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken.

"And then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in the clouds' with great power and glory, and then he will send out the angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the end of the earth to the end of the sky.

"Learn a lesson from the fig tree. When its branch becomes tender and sprouts leaves, you know that summer is near.

In the same way, when you see these things happening, know that he is near, at the gates. Amen, I say to you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. "But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father."
