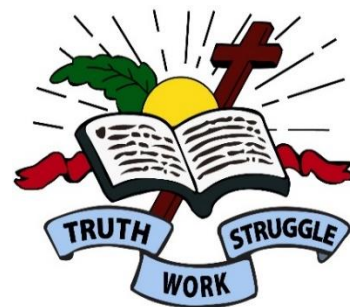

We end this church year by rendering loving allegiance to the sovereign who created our hearts and who rules them in his love. Jesus Christ is the king before whom we bow in worship.

About Today's Bible Readings

DANIEL 7:13-14

In this ancient vision, a glorious figure receives dominion over the whole world, a reign that will last forever.

Responsorial Psalm: 93:1, 1-2, 5

R. The LORD is king; he is robed in majesty.

REVELATION 1:5-8

A Christian prophet shares the message of his book: Jesus is Lord. He has saved us and deserves our grateful praise.

JOHN 18:33b-37

Before Pilate, Jesus reveals the true nature of his kingship. He rules, not my power but by truth.

ENTRANCE RITE – Sirach 18:3; Psalm 22:28-29

V. The Lord guides the world with a turn of His hand, and all things obey His will. For He is King of all, and by His power He separates what is holy from what is not.

R. All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the Lord; All the families of the nations shall bow down before Him. For dominion is the Lord's, and He rules the nations.

V. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,

R. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

THE GOSPEL – John 18:33b-37

Pilate said to Jesus, "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus answered, "Do you say this on your own or have others told you about me?" Pilate answered, "I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests handed you over to me. What have you done?" Jesus answered, "My kingdom does not belong to this world. If my kingdom did belong to this world, my attendants would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not here." So Pilate said to him, "Then you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say I am a king. For this I was born and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice."
