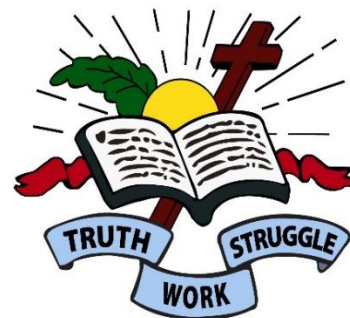

In today's Gospel, Jesus publicly introduces himself and presents his credentials. He has come to free and to forgive, to heal and to help, to teach and to save.

### About Today's Bible Readings

#### NEHEMIAH 8:2-4a, 5-6, 8-10

Here is an ancient liturgy of the word, a mirror image of what we do when we listen reverently to the Word of God.

#### RESPONSORIAL PSALM 19:8, 9, 10, 15

**R. Your words, Lord,  
are Spirit and life.**

#### 1 CORINTHIANS 12:12-30

Paul the apostle comes up with a brilliant insight into the nature of our church community: We are the body of Christ.

#### LUKE 1:1-4, 4:14-21

Luke begins his gospel with a statement of purpose, illustrated by Jesus' proclamation of the good news and its fulfillment.

### ENTRANCE RITE: Psalm 147:1-3

**V.** How good to celebrate our God in song; how sweet to give fitting praise. The Lord rebuilds Jerusalem, gathers the dispersed of Israel,

**R. Heals the brokenhearted, binds up their wounds.**

**V. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,**

**R. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.**

### THE GOSPEL: LUKE 1:1-4, 14:14-21

Since many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the events that have been fulfilled among us, just as those who were eyewitnesses from the beginning and ministers of the word have handed them down to us, I too have decided, after investigating everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may realize the certainty of the teachings you have received.

Jesus returned to Galilee in the power of the Spirit, and news of him spread throughout the whole region. He taught in their synagogues and was praised by all.

He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and went according to his custom into the synagogue on the sabbath day. He stood up to read and was handed a scroll of the prophet Isaiah. He unrolled the scroll and found the passage where it was written:

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord. Rolling up the scroll, he handed it back to the attendant and sat down, and the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at him. He said to them, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."
