

A Sabbath Thought

What's in a name? Our personal names are not only for identification but are also for vocation. We can be called because God knows who we are - by name. God's knowledge of us then becomes our own.

About Today's Bible Readings

ISAIAH 6:1-2a, 3-8

In an encounter with the living God, the prophet Isaiah discovers two things: he is saved, and he is called.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM 138:1-2, 2-3, 4-5, 7-8

R. In the sight of the angels I will sing your praises, Lord.

1 CORINTHIANS 15:1-11

In assuring the Corinthians of the Gospel he preached to them, Paul also outlines the reality of his vocation. God called him from being an enemy of Christ and made him his chief promoter.

LUKE 5:1-11

Like the prophet Isaiah, Peter finds that a meeting with God in the person of Jesus brings personal revelation and professional vocation.

THE GOSPEL: LUKE 5:1-11

While the crowd was pressing in on Jesus and listening to the word of God, he was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret. He saw two boats there alongside the lake; the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, he asked him to put out a short distance from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. After he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Simon said in reply, "Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets." When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that the boats were in danger of sinking. When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." For astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him, and likewise James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners of Simon. Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him.

This is the Gospel of the Lord!
