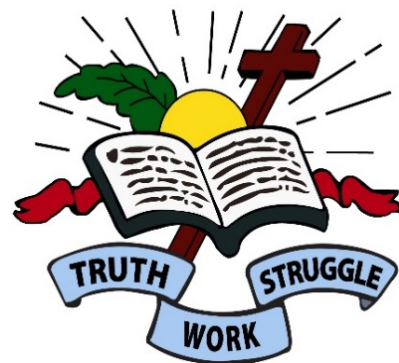

Solemnity – Corpus Christi

FAITH SHARING

The precious gift given to us by Jesus is the Holy Eucharist as our spiritual food.

Corpus Christi is the celebration of the abiding presence of a loving God in order to give thanks to our Lord for his living with us in the Eucharist. The feast also gives us an occasion to learn more about the importance and value of the "Real Presence" so that we may appreciate it and better and receive maximum benefit from the Sacrament.

BIBLE READINGS

GN 14:18-20

Today's first reading describes how the priest-king Melchizedek offered a thanksgiving-sacrifice of bread and wine to God for the welfare of the patriarch Abraham and shows how the event prefigured the Eucharistic sacrifice of the Priest-King Jesus. It is also as a sign of thanksgiving for Jesus' victory won over sin and death.

Responsorial Psalm

R. You are a priest forever, in the line of Melchizedek.

1 COR 11:23-26

St. Paul gives the earliest account of what Jesus said and did during the last meal he celebrated with his followers, interpreting it as a sacrifice.

LK 9:11B-17

Today's Gospel describes Jesus' miraculous feeding of five thousand people by multiplying five loaves of bread and two fish. This feeding is a prefiguring of Jesus' gift of the Eucharistic bread that would spiritually nourish those who believe in him

ENTRANCE HYMN

GOSPEL

LK 9:11B-17

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke.

Jesus spoke to the crowds about the kingdom of God, and he healed those who needed to be cured. As the day was drawing to a close, the Twelve approached him and said, "Dismiss the crowd so that they can go to the surrounding villages and farms and find lodging and provisions; for we are in a deserted place here."

He said to them, "Give them some food yourselves."

They replied, "Five loaves and two fish are all we have, unless we ourselves go and buy food for all these people."

Now the men there numbered about five thousand.

Then he said to his disciples, "Have them sit down in groups of about fifty."

They did so and made them all sit down. Then taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. They all ate and were satisfied. And when the leftover fragments were picked up, they filled twelve wicker baskets.

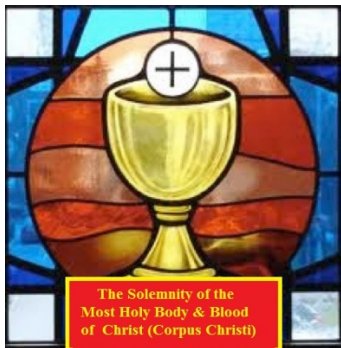
