BIBLE READINGS EX 34:4B-6, 8-9

FAITH SHARING

Today's first reading, taken from the book of Exodus, describes how God revealed His name to Moses as "Yahweh," which means, "I am Who am." But Orthodox Jews never used that name. They addressed God by calling Him Lord (Adonai).

Responsorial Psalm R. Glory and praise for ever!

2 COR 13:11-13

The second reading contains the ancient apostolic blessing in the name of the Holy Trinity: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you." Paul reminds the people of the Father's love, the grace that comes through Jesus Christ and the fellowship or the unifying power of the Holy Spirit.

JN 3:16-18

Today's Gospel comes from the story of Jesus' encounter with Nicodemus. Jesus speaks about the Father who has sent him (the Son), and after the Last Supper, He speaks about the Holy Spirit Whom he will send. He says that the Father has given him (the Son) all that He has and that Jesus, in turn, has given to the Holy Spirit all that he has received from the Father. In this we see the unity of purpose among the Three Persons of the Trinity.

Gospel JN 3:16-18

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John.

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life.

For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God.

and Wednesdays, 7:00 PM – 8:00 PM for those who cannot come in the morning.
