FAITH SHARING

We might call this Sunday "Power Sunday" because the main theme of all three readings is that God is the Source of all authority. God shares His authority with elected civil rulers to serve the people and with the Pope and the other Church leaders for the material and spiritual welfare of His children.

BIBLE READINGS IS 22:19-23

The first reading, taken from Isaiah, tells us how God hates unfaithful and selfish officials. He removed the proud "master of the royal palace" from his office, taking from Shebna the power and responsibility of which he had proven unworthy, and gave both to the humble and faithful Eliakim.

In the second reading, St. Paul praises God for the depth of His wisdom, knowledge, and correct judgments, asserting that He is the Source of all authority on earth and in Heaven.

MT 16:13-20

Today's Gospel passage shows us how Peter confesses Jesus as his *Lord and Savior* and how Jesus, in turn, approves Peter's words and gives him teaching and ruling authority in his Church. By Jesus' statement, "*I will* give you the Keys to the Kingdom of Heaven," he gives Peter and his successors the power to bind and to loose (make laws; exercise authority) in the Church, and the assurance that their decisions will be ratified in Heaven.

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew.



CHURCH IS RE-OPEN
