

FAITH SHARING

Today's readings focus on the circumstances leading up to the first coming of Jesus, the event which sets the pattern for his coming to us now and at the end of time.

2 SM 7:1-5, 8B-12, 14A, 16

The first reading surprises us by telling of God's promise to David that he would have a long line of royal descendants culminating in a final King, Jesus Christ.

R. For ever I will sing the goodness of the Lord.

ROM 16:25-27

The second reading surprises us with Paul's explanation of the unveiling of God's plan for human salvation through Jesus.

LK 1:26-38

In today's Gospel, the Angel Gabriel surprises Mary with announcements. 1) Even as a virgin betrothed to Joseph, she will become a mother. 2) She will become a mother through "the Holy Spirit [Who] will come upon you, and the Power of the Most High will overshadow you." 3) The angel continues, "Therefore, the Child to be born will be called Holy, the Son of God." 4) She is to "name the child Jesus," which means Savior. 5) God will make Him a King and, as a descendant in the line of David, 6) "He will rule over the House of Jacob forever, and of His Kingdom there will be no end." 7) As a Divine sign, Elizabeth, Mary's aged barren cousin is six months pregnant, "for," says Gabriel, "nothing shall be impossible with God!"

Gospel

LK 1:26-38

A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke.

The angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David, and the virgin's name was Mary. And coming to her, he said, "Hail, full of grace! The Lord is with you." But she was greatly troubled at what was said and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. Then the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God.

"Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give him the throne of David his father, and he will rule over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end."

But Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I have no relations with a man?" And the angel said to her in reply, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. Therefore, the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God. And behold, Elizabeth, your relative, has also conceived a son in her old age, and this is the sixth month for her who was called barren; for nothing will be impossible for God."

Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.

CHURCHES EXCLUDED FROM THE LIMITS IN PUBLIC GATHERINGS

All public gatherings in the State of Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Delaware are limited to 10 persons inside and 50 outside.

Churches, synagogues, mosques, temples and other houses of worship were excluded from the indoor gathering limits, but state officials "strongly encouraged" them to avoid congregating inside. Faith leaders should "carefully weigh the health risks to their congregants given the immense amount of community spread of COVID-19." the state's statement said.
