FAITH SHARING

The common theme of today's readings is Divine authority, as exercised in this world by the prophets of the Old Testament in their messages, by the apostles, in their writings and teaching in the New Testament, and by Jesus in his teaching and healing ministry.

DT 18:15-20

Today's first reading tells us that a true prophet like Moses speaks with authority because it is God Who speaks through him.

Responsorial Psalm

R. If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.

1 COR 7:32-35

In the second reading, St. Paul exercises his God-given authority as the Apostle to the Gentiles to teach people in Corinth that marriage is a holy state ordained by God and that it is a life-long partnership according to the teaching of the Lord. But he opts for, and recommends, celibacy, so that one may serve the Lord without the distractions of married life.

MK 1:21-28

In today's Gospel, Mark describes one sample Sabbath day of Jesus' public life. Jesus joins in public worship in the synagogue as a practicing Jew, heals the sick, drives out evil spirits and prays privately. People immediately noticed that Jesus teaches with authority and heals with Divine power.


