FAITH SHARING

Today's Scripture readings are about the family. A family is a community where everybody's rights are recognized and honored, where happiness and lasting relationships rest on mutual respect. An authentic family is much more than a biological unit: It is organized in the spiritual service of Christ.

<u>First reading</u> teaches us that it is wisdom to realize that respect, honor and mutual recognition of rights makes for longevity in relationships, especially within families.

Dress up to stay at home because you will need the best of clothes: shared suffering, kindness, humility, gentle mannerisms and patience. Let love be the crown you wear around the house – we can learn from today's <u>second reading</u>.

Jesus' own family gave him a place to grow - in strength and wisdom and God's favor. Every organized relationship of human persons has to provide that opportunity for each other – that is the lesson from our <u>Gospel</u> reading today.

Gospel

LUKE 2:41-52

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke.

The parents of Jesus used to go every year to Jerusalem for the feast of the Passover, and when He was twelve they went up for the celebration, as was their custom. As they were returning at the end of the feast, the Child Jesus remained behind unknown to His parents. Thinking He was in the party, they continued their journey for a day, looking for Him among their relatives and acquaintances. Not finding Him, they returned to Jerusalem in search of Him. On the third day they came upon Him in the temple sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. And all who heard Him were amazed at His intelligence and His answers. When His parents saw Him they were astonished, and His mother said to Him: "Son, why have you done this to us? You see that Your father and I have been searching for You in sorrow." He said to them: "Why did you search for Me? Did you not know I had to be in My Father's house?" But they did not grasp what He said to them. He went down with them then, and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them. His mother meanwhile kept all these things in memory. Jesus, for His part, progressed steadily in wisdom and age and grace before God and men.
