FAITH SHARING

On the day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles as fiery tongues. The frightened apostles were transformed into fiery preachers and evangelizers and were given the gift of tongues by a special anointing of the Holy Spirit. The listeners experienced a fresh anointing of the Holy Spirit through the apostles' gift of tongues: they heard Peter speaking in their native languages. The early Christians became powerful witnesses and brave martyrs for their Faith in Jesus.

First reading describes in detail the miraculous transformation that took place during the first Christian Pentecost, thus fulfilling Jesus' promise to his apostles that they would receive "power from on high."

In our second reading St. Paul explains how the sharing of the various spiritual gifts of the Holy Spirit enriches the Church.

In the Gospel reading entering the still locked Upper Room, Jesus greets His apostles, sends them to carry on the mission given him by his Heavenly Father, and empowers them to do so by breathing upon them and saying, "Receive the Holy Spirit." Jesus fulfills his promise to send the Advocate or Paraclete on them - "Power from on high."

And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."
